How's your Lent going? We are close to Palm Sunday and the climax of these sacred 40 days. If you have been following the journey of Jesus towards Calvary, you will have found some action to bind you closer to him; if you haven't made much of a start, there is still time to let Lent work for you.

The Second Reading for Palm Sunday Mass is <u>Philippians 2:6-11</u>. Read this passage slowly, several times. Think about the enormity of what is taught here: Jesus stepping out of his divinity to become one of us; not stopping there but going further – gifting his life for us. He conquers death and restores life!

Can you take this teaching seriously, or is it too much to believe? Read it again and consider how it might speak to your life, and to the life of your family. How could this claim survive if it was without truth? It is the heart of the Lenten season with so much to offer those who can say, *Yes, I believe.*


