Year 8 Boys Sacred Heart **Lions** won against EBIS 4-1.


Special thanks to Mr Grevatt who is coordinating touch rugby for the school.

Update from the Board of Trustees

Hi All

Over the last six months we have been focusing on refreshing some of the school's systems and services, some of this as a result of ensuring we keep up with requirements (for example our health and safety practises, how we address school fees and voluntary donations), others to support our existing services (for example the popular and highly valued after school service), and others to refresh what we are about as a Board (and if you go onto the school website you will see a very succinct statement about the values that guide us as a Board).

More visibly the school has updated the classroom furniture which the students and staff are delighted with, continuing the theme of a refresh. We have also committed to a refresh of the playgrounds and sought some proposals of what a modern and stimulating outdoor environment might look like. We will be consulting with staff, students and you on these proposals later this term or early in the New Year.

Unlike state schools we are not funded for capital improvements. Responsibility for funding of capital improvements is a matter for the Archdiocese, and the Archdiocese will have many demands on them given the needs of our Catholic schools throughout the greater Wellington area. So the funding of playground improvements will need the strong support of the school community. We are very fortunate to have the Parents and Friends Trustees who are keen to help raise funds for the playground upgrade and they will be promoting social events and fund raising events in due course and will be looking for your support.



Here's a new take on the Ten Commandments. L'Arche is an international movement providing residential support for people with learning disabilities. It was founded by Canadian, Jean Vanier, and takes a most positive approach to life, emphasising the innate goodness in people.

Jean Vanier's sister, Therese, introduced L'Arche to the UK. In a recent book about Therese and her work, the story is told of a version of the Ten Commandments which Therese composed and gave to a friend. They include:

- Thou shalt not be perfect, or even try to be.
- Thou shalt not spread thyself too thinly.
- Thou shalt schedule time for thyself and thy supportive network.
- Thou shalt not be thine own worst enemy, but be thy best friend.
