Well now you can!

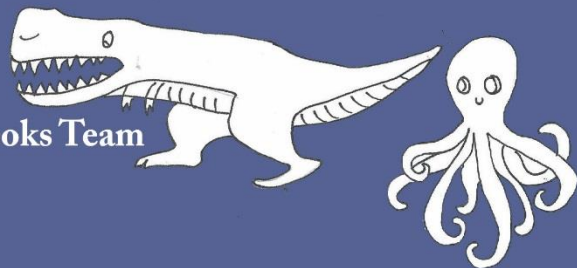

2pm Every Saturday - Ages 7-13

Off the back of our successful 11am storytime for 1-6 year olds, we are excited to be expanding our storytime initiative into a 2pm session for 7-13 year olds.

This new program, The Vic Books Book Club, will offer your young book worms an opportunity to celebrate the books they love, as well as a platform from which they can develop their creative writing skills.

Each week we will read the best books for this age group, as well as discuss the books we love. Your kids will get an opportunity to learn about a wide range of books and learn to understand and enjoy them even more deeply.

As part of these sessions the kids will also get the opportunity to practise their creative writing. They can choose whichever form they are excited about (poetry, short stories ect...) however, for those interested in chapter books, we will aim to write a chapter a week so that returning kids will eventually create an entire chapter book.

In future sessions we intend to invite professional writers, illustrators and other book professionals to come and talk with the kids, teaching them new skills and further expanding their love and understanding of books.

We believe that young writers and readers like yours aren't getting the early support and encouragement that say an athlete or dancer gets at the same age. With other hobbies and skilled endeavours kids are encouraged to start developing skills at a young age and we feel writing and reading should be the same.

As a club, we hope that this venture will bring together like minded kids to not only learn and have fun but also to socialise with kids who share the same interests as them.
