Uniform - Please ensure your child is in the correct school uniform. We have noticed that students are not wearing their school shoes to school in the morning. For your uniform requirements please see Robyn at After School Care. Ties can be ordered through the office and cost \$25. Please note Netball hoodies are not part of the school uniform.

Full winter uniform for boys: Green school jersey, long sleeve grey shirt, tie, grey shorts/trousers, long grey socks with green stripes and black school shoes, plain BLACK (not Green) jacket – this can be a raincoat or puffer jacket. Optional: green sleeveless school vest.

Full winter uniform for girls: Years 1-6: blackwatch tartan pinafore, long sleeve white blouse, tie, green jersey, black tights or long white socks, black school shoes. Years 7-8 girls: blackwatch skirt instead of pinafore, rest of school uniform identical to Years 1-6 girls, plain BLACK (not Green) jacket – either raincoat or puffer jacket. Three weeks ago, after the Parish received an interim report from engineers, identifying a structural problem with some of the rafters, the Board of Trustees decided not to use the Cathedral for school services. We await a fuller report but accept that the Cathedral is "earthquake prone" and will have to be closed while remedial work is done.

Learning this, one of our students, planning a birthday party, asked friends to give money instead of presents. Whatever was received would be donated to the Parish "to help with the Cathedral roof repair". An envelope containing \$225 has been given to me for this purpose. I found the gesture quite overwhelming. Such thoughtful generosity from a very young person calls for great applause.

Making a choice to go without that others might benefit, signals maturity and awareness. These qualities are still developing in our young donor, so I conclude that faith and family have played a significant role in this action. The child was under no pressure; the gesture was spontaneous. I am in awe of the love that prompted it.

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
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
