

Bee Healthy Regional Health Dental Service: The Bee Healthy Regional dental service visited our school in Term 1 and completed annual dental examinations for our students who are enrolled in the service. Of the 181 students who were examined, 75 had tooth decay - that equates to 41%. Research has shown that one of the simplest and effective ways to reduce rates of tooth decay is to replace sugary drinks such as fizzy drinks, energy drinks, sports drinks, fruit drinks and juices, flavoured milks and waters, powdered drinks and cordial with water or plain milk.
