

Sacred Heart Cathedral School will close on TOMORROW August 15^{th} due to the strike Dear Parents and Caregivers,

The NZEI has advised the Board that our Principal and teachers will be taking strike action from 7am to 7pm on Wednesday 15 August 2018.

The Board has considered whether an education service can be provided on August 15 -but given the absence of the Principal and teaching staff we have concluded that we cannot provide a teaching service during that period. As a result the School will be closed that day and no School related services (including after school care) will be provided and no staff will be at School on that day.

I know this will be inconvenient for many parents as, like our family, you will need to make alternative arrangements for care of your child or children on that day. I do note that this is the first day of industrial action taken by the staff of our School in 22 years, and hopefully a resolution to the underlying issues will be found that both the Government and NZEI can accommodate.


